Community Impact



All of our projects relate to at least one of these impact areas, which all help support our main goal of increasing the high school graduation rate in the Jackson area.

This year we have more than 30 community projects and initiatives, plus our Connecting Communities Day of Service. We volunteer an average of 1,057 hours a week! Those hours represent a lot of women doing a lot of hard work, and the results have been phenomenal. Community Impact Project Highlights

Many of our community projects carry a heavy load in the first half of our League year, which began on June 1, 2018. Some are even completed in the first months of the year. Below are some highlights of what we have already accomplished with your help this 2018-2019 League year.



JPS Summer Camp

Campers became SUPERHEROES this summer at JPS Summer Camp. League volunteers provided enrichment activities for third and fourth grade students at Pecan Park Elementary School. The activities focused on improving reading, language arts, math, science, and social studies skills. Volunteers also provided activities focused on art, drama and physical education. Camp ended with a family celebration where each child shared his or her desired super power and was given a super hero cape and a backpack with all the tools necessary to have a super year.



Camp Connections

Camp Connections, a new community project in 2018-2019, was a huge success! Designed with member flexibility in mind, Camp Connections allowed League volunteers the opportunity to work on several different initiatives throughout the summer with shifts at multiple camps. Camp Connections also provided support to community partners who need additional help in the summer months. This summer, volunteers stayed very busy as they helped Stewpot Lunch-n-Learn, Operation Shoestring Summer Reading Program, Backpack Buddies, and all of the JLJ-hosted summer camps.



BGCCM Library Makeover Project

Our League volunteers worked throughout the summer and fall to renovate the library at the Boys and Girls Club on Raymond Road. The updated room is beautiful, functional, and educational, with new built-in shelving, inspirational quotes, fun paintings, new carpet, blinds, furniture, and even a smart board! The volunteers held a cupcake party to unveil the finished product to the children at the BGCCM, and their eyes lit up with excitement as they saw their new space.



Public School Mini-Grants


In partnership with Community Foundation for Mississippi and JPS Partners in Education, JLJ volunteers evaluated teacher grant proposals and selected grant recipients in JPS elementary, middle, and high schools. In September, we were honored to present \$100,000 in minigrants to enhance, enrich, and support the JPS educational curriculum, along with more than 600 pairs of NEW uniform pants and shorts for JPS students. This project has awarded more than \$1 million to JPS teachers since its inception in 1988.



Fund Development Highlights

The Junior League of Jackson maintains three fund development businesses: Mistletoe Marketplace, Junior League Jumble, and Touch a Truck[®] Jackson. Each year, these businesses bring in more than \$1 million to support our mission, which includes the development and training of our members and our work in the community. We are grateful for the support of our sponsors, and we want to be good stewards of your investment in our work. Mistletoe Marketplace kicks off our annual fund development efforts each November. Thank you for your support of this 38 year-old fundraiser, which is a massive undertaking. Planning begins more than 15 months in advance and almost every Active and Provisional member of the League volunteers at the event, in addition to her other volunteer responsibilities in the League.

Mistletoe Marketplace 2018 was held November 7-10 at the Mississippi Trade Mart in Jackson. This year, we sold over 20,000 general admission and special event tickets, and we estimate that more than 30,000 people attended. We should have final numbers in early 2019.




