PROJECT UPDATES

The Junior League of Jackson is honored to partner with many community organizations to host projects that focus on early literacy, children's health, and the social development of children and youth. All of our projects relate to at least one of these impact areas, which all help support our main goal of increasing the high school graduation rate in the Jackson area.

Through our more than 30 community projects and initiatives JLJ volunteers an average of 1,057 hours a week! Those hours represent a lot of women doing a lot of hard work, and the results have been phenomenal. These projects and initiatives would not be possible without our corporate sponsors and community partners, and we want you to know the impact of your support.



OUR READING FAMILY

New this year, volunteers are assisting the **Institute of Southern Jewish Life**'s Saturday literacy program. Held at a local library, JLJ volunteers offer support with reading programs and creative activities with children, while the staff trains parents on strategies to increase literacy awareness at home. This project truly engages the entire family.

JPS MINI-GRANTS

partnership with In Community Foundation for Mississippi and JPS Partners Education, JLJ in volunteers evaluated teacher grant and selected proposals grant recipients from JPS schools. In September, we were honored to present \$103,000 in mini grants to enhance, enrich, and support the JPS educational curriculum. This project has awarded more than \$2 million to JPS teachers since its inception in 1988.
